



Longest Distance in 24 hours on a Personal Watercraft(Aquabike)(Jetski)

Evidence Required

1. Cover letter (summarizing the details of your record attempt – when, where, who and which record– as well as its precise measurements. Please also detail what you are including in your evidence).
2. At least one independent witness statement or one signed affidavit by a civil law notary (please note that in the USA, a Notary Public does not qualify under the Civil Law Notary option and therefore cannot act as sole witness for a record attempt) confirming the measurements and details of your claim.
3. Expert witness statements (All witness statements must be written by the witnesses and include their title and full contact details. They must include details of witness qualifications and in the case of expert witnesses, why they are an expert in that field. They must be signed by the witnesses in their own hand.)
4. Printouts of satellite tracking data and GPS
5. Video footage of the record attempt on DVD .(Edited with subtitles)(Please ensure that the video camera time is in sync with the event clock.)
6. High-quality labelled colour photographs of your record attempt.(Show time and date info from the camera on the photographs and ensure that this is in sync with the event clock)
7. Specific evidence (as requested in the Guidelines sent to you for your record attempt): log books, official and expert statements and lap measurement details and charts, a list of all stewards (complete with profession, address and phone numbers), and so on.

Failure to provide any of the material listed here and in the Guidelines document may result in your claim being rejected, so please check the documentation before you submit it.

You can also send any other materials that you would like us to review, or to share as back-up evidence, such as media coverage generated by your record attempt (newspaper articles, news videos, etc). Note: these cannot be used to replace any of the above.

1. COVER LETTER

This must outline the details of the record that you are claiming and describe the evidence you are submitting. This must also outline any specific incidents during the event – for example a mechanical failure, an injury or extreme weather conditions – and any other details you think relevant to your claim or which you wish to share with us.

You must also submit the full name, postal address, telephone number and e-mail address of the record holder, so that these details are correct in our records database.
